## Sports Premium Grant

This year Coates Lane Primary school was allocated **£8,910**.

Below is a breakdown of the PE Grant Expenditure so far this year and its whole school impact.

### Rationale & Impact

All children are to be encouraged to 'have a go' and know that their efforts will be appreciated and praised whatever the outcome. With this ethos we aspire to see at least 50% of the children in school taking part in sport at some point in the year and many taking part on a regular basis, making sport and challenging themselves a life choice.

To develop engagement in inclusion sport, where pupils with SEN or additional needs have the opportunity to access and compete in Inclusive Sports Events alongside other children with similar needs from other schools. Events scheduled are: Kurling, Indoor Athletics & Multiskills.

Specialist Sports Coaches are available for PE lessons or After School Clubs such as: Golf, Cricket, Rugby, Dance, Gymnastics, Bikeability, Hockey & Rock Climbing.

Children have a plethora of opportunities to represent their school in inter-school tournaments, compete in leagues and the enjoyment of participation in festivals. We have established many links with local schools within the West Craven Cluster and have many events scheduled alongside the SSP timetable to help break social barriers and share outstanding practice.

**Rationale & Impact**

As a school, we have funded a specialist PE coach (Phil Cain) to deliver energetic and highly engaging PE sessions to all our children for the past 4 years.

Phil is an ambassador for sport and inclusive education. He emulates our school mission statement each and every lesson, where happiness is at the heart of each child under his duty of care. He promotes the love of participation and young leadership in all aspects of his role in Coates Lane Primary School.

Phil actively supports Miss Johnston (PE Coordinator) in her aspiration for the school to achieve GOLD level in the School Games Mark this

year. Each half term he organises intra-school leagues which take place on Friday lunchtimes e.g. football and table tennis. Phil also offers an extra-curricular activity on Friday afternoons after school. Some of the clubs so far have been: Change4Life, Multiskills, Dodgeball and Cross Country.

## Our Quest for Gold



This year we will be striving to achieve GOLD level in the School Games Mark. As a former gymnastics coach and someone who has been competing in many sports teams throughout my life, I wish to instil the same passion for getting active and challenging yourself across Coates Lane. Therefore, to increase the number of children attending after school sporting clubs, my approach as the new PE coordinator will be solely child-centred.



Another prerequisite of achieving gold level is that we, as a school, harness the local community within Barnoldswick and establish at least five local club links. Therefore, I would also like to hear about clubs which children at Coates Lane attend outside of school. I have been eternally grateful for all families who have supported our recent questionnaires. From this, during our active theme week many local clubs were willing to come in and offer taster sessions throughout the week for all year groups.

We are very lucky in Coates Lane to have so many staff members who have a sporting background, many of whom still compete in sporting events within their own teams. Currently Mr Newsham is our football coach, Mrs Thompson and myself coach netball, and Miss Burn our KS1 HLTA has been utilised as another after school coach as she holds many qualifications in a variety of sports.

## Playground Leader Training

As part of the essential criteria for achieving Gold, a proportion of children on roll must be provided with training opportunities to develop their leadership skills.



Recently we were very lucky to have the support of Fiona Callaghan (SGO Pendle) who came in and trained an elected team of Playground Leaders within our school. From this, the team have been issued with tabards and a timetable to which they share the responsibility, throughout the week, of promoting active lunchtimes on the playground and a platform for making friends by setting up games in designated areas. The children have been trained to look for children who may be alone or sitting on the 'Buddy Bench' each playtime.

Already we have received more and more children who wish to join the team so that they too can support our aspiration to improve sports etiquette, lunchtime behaviour and whole school nurturing approach.
