

Year 1 - Week Commencing 5th March 2018

Maths

This week, we will continue our learning about division. We have showed good understanding of division by sharing and grouping using objects and are moving on to represent our working out using pictures this week. We will be reading and finding the answers to various simple division number sentences e.g. $12 \div 3 = .$ We will also be having a go at problem solving and reasoning linked to division e.g. How many different ways can you find to divide the number 12 into groups? Explain. Later in the week, we will move on to measures and be learning about the standard units of centimetres and metres

English

We will be continuing with the story of Rumpelstiltskin this week. Firstly, we will be writing a book review to share what we think of the book. We will also be acting out parts of the story through drama (freeze-framing) and chunking the main parts of the story so that we can then innovate these parts. We will be creating our own story boards with changed parts of the story e.g. a witch instead of a little old man or a girl who can turn pasta, not straw, into gold.

Theme

We will be continuing our History theme this week, looking at our baby photos and discussing how we have changed. We will be discussing birthdays and what they represent, along with some of the main elements of a birthday. In PSHE, we begin a new theme centred on raising awareness of Disability. This week, we will be discussing what we know about disability and having a visit from two visually-impaired ladies as part of World Book Day. We will be completing various book-related activities for World Book Day on Monday pm. Mr Maiden will be reading to the class as part of a 'story swap'.
