Maths This week we will be looking at the following:

- Solving problems by converting between units of measure.
- Converting between miles and kilometres.
- Solving problems involving time.
- Naming the parts of a circle and knowing that the diameter is twice the radius.
- Recognising, describing and building simple 3-D shapes, including making nets.

English

The children will be completing their independent write based on the question, 'Should animals be kept in captivity?' They have made an excellent start and I am looking forward to reading their finished pieces. We will then be moving on to looking at mystery/detective stories. We will be reading a book called Foul Play by Tom Palmer and will be completing reading and writing tasks linked to this.
