

Year 1 - Week Commencing 3rd December 2018



Maths

This week we will be assessing the children's understanding of the learning so far this term. This will be done in small groups and in a relaxed way - it will not be formal tests as they are still too young to be formally tested.

Whilst not being assessed, the children will be working on a range of objectives related to time:

- Measuring and recording time in seconds and minutes.
- Sequencing events in chronological order.
- Use language of days, weeks, months & years.



English

Having finished our narrative unit based on Zog, we are now moving on to a non-fiction unit where we will be looking at a range of non-fiction texts related to the Great Fire of London and other 'fire' related areas.

I would like the class to produce a class book which could be added to our school library for other children to read and enjoy.

Theme

This week the children will be continuing to work on the moving pictures with Mrs. Mackie, which are based on the Great Fire of London.

We will also be continuing our rehearsals for our Christmas production. The children are loving learning the songs and I have a feeling this production is going to be a real Christmas cracker!
